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## welcome to Jasper

Hey, you made it here! Not everyone does. Jasper is off the beaten path, but those that find our corner of the Rockies quickly fall in love. The national park's shimmering glaciers, abundant wildlife, crystalclear lakes, thundering waterfalls, deep canyons and evergreen forest—and of course towering mountains—helped earn it a UNESCO World Heritage Site designation. It is one of only 22 such sites in Canada. At 11,228 square kilometres (4,335 square miles), Jasper National Park is also Canada's largest park in the Rocky Mountains and the largest accessible Dark Sky Preserve in the world.

Jasper is a unique combination: a wild, rugged, uncrowded natural wonderland with laid-back, unpretentious amenities. The tight-knit community that lives here is part of our charm. But like many

small towns, we have our quirks. Jasperites are almost aggressively nice. Some local pronunciations stump newcomers. For example, the word Maligne (as in Maligne Valley/Road/Lake/Canyon) is said like mah-LEEN (rhymes with clean) and not like the verb "to malign" (rhymes with define). And come winter, a toque becomes the de facto town-wide uniform, even inside.

So now that you're here, how long should you stay? Well, there are lifelong locals who still feel they've barely scratched the surface of all there is to do in Jasper. But if your travel time is limited, as it so often is, then this guide can help. Over the following pages we invite you to go deeper into Jasper and discover the experiences, people, and stories you'll be talking about for years after returning home. Get ready to venture beyond.

#### DRIVING TO JASPER

Highway 16, also known as "the Yellowhead," is the main east-west route through Jasper and is part of the famous Trans-Canada Highway. The Icefields Parkway (highway 93) runs north-south and is considered one of the most scenic drives in the world. Plan your journey to Jasper at jasper.travel/getting-here.

Road-trippers should factor in extra time for scenic stops, wildlife slowdowns and/ or weather changes. Or, let a professional take the wheel and book an airport shuttle, transport bus, or private charter tour with SunDog Transportation and Tour Co. (p.28). With service to Edmonton, Calgary, Banff and many places in-between, this homegrown business prides itself on quality service and thoughtful details like hotel pick-ups and large windows well-suited to sightseeing and taking photos.

#### 5 TIPS FOR DRIVING THE ICEFIELDS PARKWAY IN WINTER

#### **Confirm conditions**

Weather is often different on the parkway than surrounding areas. Check road reports at 511.alberta.ca.

#### Watch for wildlife

The parkway passes through caribou habitat. Be alert, drive the speed limit and keep multiple buslengths of distance from any animals.

#### **Bring supplies**


Much of the highway has no cellphone reception. Have an emergency kit that includes warm clothing, food, and water.

#### Leave early

Allow plenty of time to fully enjoy the views along the route. When safe, pull off to roadside stops to snap pictures.

#### Fill up before leaving

There is nowhere to get gas between Jasper and Lake Louise in winter. Snow tires are mandatory from November through March.



#### **Gear Tips**

Be ready for any Jasper adventure in any season with these guiding principles:

- 1. Weather can change quickly in the mountains. Be prepared with multiple layers.
- 2. Higher elevation = chillier. If you're hiking into the alpine or driving to places like the Columbia Icefield or Maligne Lake, a hat or mitts can be nice to have even in summer.
- 3. Bring physical maps or have maps predownloaded on your device, as some areas of the national park don't have cell service.

#### **JOURNEY BIKE GUIDES**

For a sights-rich ride that gets you out of a vehicle and onto the trails, the mountain bike tours led by this small company are a thrilling option. Cover more ground in less time than you'd be able to on foot, and choose from ride difficulty levels that range from leisurely to adrenaline-pumped. The guide gives local insight into hidden gems, helps with biking tips, and carries crucial kit (first aid, pumps, tubes, bear spray) so you can travel light and comfortable. Started by young cycle-preneur Elissa Cummings—who got the idea while biking the Continental Divide from Jasper to Mexico—Journey Bike Guides also offers fat biking tours in the winter. Equipped with giant studded tires, these unique bikes offer a fun way to see the trails while covered in snow.

#### CANADIAN SKYLINE ADVENTURES

In operation for over a decade, professional guides Sarah and Christian are experienced locals who put a lot of heart and prep work into getting you off the beaten path. Day hikers and families can learn the natural and human history of the area in small group sizes. Looking for a challenge? They'll help you gain more than 1,000 metres of elevation to summit iconic peaks like Bonhomme and Opal, or cover anywhere from 5 to 20 kilometres on one of their private, guided running tours. They also offer Backpacking 101 experiences and multi-day hiking tours through the Brazeau Valley and along the North and South Boundary trails; ask about their porter service if you don't fancy carrying your own gear.

#### HIGH SIGHTS GUIDING

For a taste of Jasper's backcountry trails and a bed to flop onto at night, these lodge-hopping trips are unique adventures. The personable Jo Nadeau leads small groups through some of Jasper's premiere areas and has all the guiding chops, as well as First Responder and adventure medic certifications. Each trip's destination: a remote lodge that'll serve as basecamp for day trips. Explore the spectacular Skyline Trail, the wildlife rich Tonquin Valley, and the hidden gem Fryatt Valley. The three daily backcountry meals are shockingly delicious, considering the remoteness of the kitchen. Also on offer: private day trips, trail running and custom adventures.

Run by a small family of guides, this outfitter provides guided half-day and full-day hikes that range from easy and flower-filled to challenging and exposed. Their wildlife hiking tours in the spring and fall are a hit, and they also offer private sightseeing tours, as well as rock climbing programs. In the winter, they lead Maligne Canyon Icewalks (p.25) as well as snowshoeing and AST1 avalanche skills courses. Environmental stewardship is a core tenet of their business, with leave-no-trace ethics and team participation in annual clean-up efforts along the highway and trails. Dog-lovers will fall in love with the owner's impressively-trained Suka, who joins some of the (approved) trips too.

Go further into the wilderness with this new company. Their adventures focus on longer and more remote backcountry trails, including the rugged North and South Boundary Trails, with the aim of helping people tackle hikes that they'd otherwise not be able to do. New backpackers might prefer their Fiddle River trip, which still offers that remote serenity. You'll walk away having seen beautiful and historic areas that few other park visitors get to witness, and newfound confidence in your own backcountry abilities. The lead guide, Ben Nearingburg, is an expert hiker and Jasper local who literally wrote the book on peakbagging in the Rockies and has many stories to tell.

TRAVEL TIP: If it's raining out, rafting is one of the best activities to do in the park. After all, you're likely going to get wet anyway. Plus, the extra water can make the rapids even more lively!

#### **ROCKY MOUNTAIN RIVER GUIDES**

Water has been a powerful force of change within the national park and when shooting the Sunwapta River's Class III rapids, it's easy to see why. Rocky Mountain River Guides offers a thrilling adventure for adrenaline seekers and water lovers who prefer to peep incredible scenery through the spray of fast, fun waves. The Sunwapta's Indigenous name roughly translates to turbulent waters and the trip ends with a glacial faceful of water from a wave called The Whopper. For a more moderate adrenaline rush, there's also two slightly milder tours down the Athabasca River, which are great options for participants travelling with children between 5-12. No previous experience is necessary for any of the tours, so everyone can release their inner river rat!

#### MALIGNE RAFTING ADVENTURES

This longstanding company rafts more rivers than any other Jasper outfitter. The Athabasca, Sunwapta and Fraser Rivers each have different intensities, from Class II rapids (great for families and apprehensive first-timers) to Class III+ (perfect for fit beginners and adrenaline seekers). The Athabasca Falls Canyon Run splashes through some fun, gentler Class II+ rapids before floating into the scenic Athabasca Valley. The Sunwapta River Trip is Class III, with a steep gradient and many rapids that are most intense mid-June to late July. Or, travel a bit further afield to reach the mighty Fraser River (trust us, the drive is worth it). Count on getting wet in this river's turbulent Class III+ rapids. Includes a short portage and the chance to spot seasonal spawning salmon.

#### NEW LIFT


The new Knob Quad chair is now complete, joining a fleet of eight lifts that shuttle you all over the mountain. The speedy new quad chair unloads at an elevation of 2,518 metres, giving easy access to the highest points of the upper mountain including Marmot Cirque, the newest terrain opened in March 2023.

#### 2 GREAT FOR FAMILIES

Need childcare while you shred? No problem. Marmot Basin's on-mountain Little Rascals Nursery entertains tots from 19 months to 6 years old. If your kids want to hit the slopes, programs like Marmot Mites or Tiny Tracks are great options.

#### VARIETY OF RUNS

Of the mountain's 91 runs, there's a nice split between beginner, intermediate and expert (plus terrain parks) so no one's stuck to one area. Also, all ski routes eventually converge, making it easy for groups of various experience levels to arrange meet-ups.



#### **4** EXPERT TERRAIN

For powder hounds looking to shred, the newly opened "Cirque" offers the best high alpine expert terrain in the Canadian Rockies. Located above the tree line, its bowls and chutes are only surpassed by its views. Hit the mountain's steep, long north face with "Tres Hombres."

#### **5** APRÈS CULTURE

There's two on-mountain chalets where you can take part in the time-honoured tradition of reliving the day's adventures over some bevvies next to a fire. Select events through the year amp up the atmosphere with live music, mascots and more.

#### MEET THE LOCALS



#### **OLIVER ANDREW**

This born-and-raised local (his family has owned and managed the Astoria Hotel [p.58] since 1925) was strapped into skis almost from the moment he could walk. Here are his top tips to get the best ski trip possible.

#### Grab a shuttle

During peak season the Jasper-Marmot Ski Bus operates daily, stopping at many of the hotels around Jasper along the way (including the Astoria). Buy tickets online from Sundog Tour Co. (p.29), at participating hotels or on the hill.

#### Hidden gems

The Cornice is a big hike but always worth it for the steep lines. On powder days ski the lift line on the Eagle Ridge Chair for fresh pockets of snow all day. Hiking the Peak will give you an epic view even when conditions aren't the best.

#### **Best times**

Get up to Marmot early to catch the early morning groomed runs while the sun rises. Midweek skiing is best for easy parking and no lift lines!

### **CLIMBING AND OTHER ADVENTURES**

There are so many unique ways to explore the national park. Get higher, go deeper, and make story-worthy memories with these special activities.



#### ICE CLIMBING

Visiting in winter? Don some ice cleats and discover Rockaboo Mountain Adventure's exhilarating and surprisingly beginner-friendly Ice Climbing Experience. If you can climb a ladder, you can climb a frozen waterfall. The six-hour excursion is a great way to find out why ice climbers from around the world travel to the Canadian Rockies.

#### TREAD LIGHTLY GLACIER TOUR

As one of the most accessible glaciers in the world, Athabasca Glacier has wowed many visitors. A gravel trail leads the general public to this famous landmark, but only certified guides (and the people they escort) are allowed to walk on it. Enter: Rockaboo Mountain Adventures. With small group sizes and top-notch expert staff, their tours are perfect for explorers who want to get up close and personal with this ever-changing wonder (depending on conditions, a tour might even venture into an ice cave). Deepen your connection to the landscape and contribute to on-going research projects by learning how to collect scientific samples. Offered from June 1 to September 30.

#### **ROCK CLIMBING**

See the national park from a higher perspective and clamber up some limestone. Complete beginners can learn the ropes (literally) from Rockaboo Mountain Adventures' (p.66) four-hour trips, or via Jasper Hikes & Tours' (p.19) Learn to Rock Climb experience. Tune in your spidey senses as you rappel, belay, and climb a wall overlooking the Athabasca River. 

#### **ICE WALKS**

Most people visit Maligne Canyon in the summer. Thus, most people miss out on one of Jasper's most otherworldly adventures. Once the water drains and the canyon floor freezes, you can explore the canyon's hidden depths with a guided tour (anti-slip crampons and helmets provided). See waterfalls of ice, magnificent natural sculptures and fun features like the "Corkscrew". Three local providers offer these unique IceWalk tours. Book with Pursuit for a 2.5 hour tour with multiple departure times (easily paired with a tasty to-go lunch from the Maligne Canyon Wilderness Kitchen). The 3-to-3.5-hour SunDog Tour Co. (p.29) experience can be packaged with a Winter Wildlife Discovery Tour for a discounted price. Jasper Hikes and Tours (p.19) leads small groups on 3-hour tours. Icewalk tours are usually available from mid-December to late March, depending on weather, and appropriate for ages six and older.



#### SKATING

Not including the Jasper Arena (303 Bonhomme St.) there's two main places to skate in Jasper National Park. Pyramid Lake has a rink with stunning views of Pyramid Mountain. Rent skates (or other winter sports gear) and grab dinner from the nearby Pyramid Lake Lodge (**p.53**). The groomed ice at Mildred Lake is on the grounds of Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge (**p.52**); their Winter Activity Centre also has rentals available (plus helmets, hockey sticks, and pucks, if you fancy a game of shinny).




#### **CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING**

Once the lakes freeze over, they provide the perfect surface for easy, scenic cross-country skiing. Choose between short, flat loops or longer, more challenging routes. There are more than 100 kilometres of groomed trails within an hour of downtown Jasper. Need rentals? The Winter Activity Center at Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge (p.52) can help from about December to April. In downtown Jasper, grab rentals from Totem Ski Shop (p.10) or Jasper Source for Sports (p.10).

### **ADVENTURE AT YOUR OWN PACE**

The mountains may be epic, but that doesn't mean you must break a sweat to fully enjoy them. The following extraordinary experiences are perfect for travellers who want gentler journeys.



#### **JASPER RAFT TOURS**

Bring the whole family on this gentle, scenic and fun float tour down the Athabasca River. The specially designed seven-metre-long orange rafts provide stability and comfort while the funny and competent guides do all the rowing and point out wildlife along the way. Everyone from ages 3 to 99 can hop aboard this accommodating tour, which travels a leisurely stretch of the river that's mostly calm but does feature a few small rapids. During the 60 to 90 minutes spent on the water (exact duration depends on water level; total tour lasts between 2 to 2.5 hours). Tours run rain or shine through the spring, summer and fall. Leashed dogs are welcome on the advance-booked Dog Friendly trips (find more petfriendly activities on p.38).

#### WILD CURRENT OUTFITTERS

Canoeing is to Canada what cheese curds are to fries and gravy. #### **Swimming**

On hot days, Lake Annette and Lake Edith are refreshing spots. Each has a beach, trails, picnic tables, outhouses, and metal fire rings with grills. For warmer soaks head to the Miette Hot Springs (p.47)



#### **Fishing**

Bring a rod or go with a guide (p.35) to Talbot Lake, Maligne Lake, Athabasca River or upper Maligne River. Don't forget to buy your national park fishing permit, available from Parks Canada.



#### Skating or skiing

Once frozen, many lakes become popular spots for skating and cross-country skiing. Find maintained ovals at Mildred Lake and Pyramid Lake. If not at a maintained spot, always check for safe ice depth.

#### FAIRMONT JASPER PARK LODGE GOLF COURSE

Even if you don't get a hole-in-one while playing the golf course at Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge (p.52), you'll feel like you did. That's because almost every hole on this exquisitely crafted public golf course is perfectly framed by a mountain vista, with thick forest or the emerald waters of Lac Beauvert alongside. Designed in 1925 by Canada's most famous golf course architect, Stanley Thompson, this iconic collection of wide fairways, elevated tee boxes and dramatic bunkers is on every golfer's bucket list for a reason. With tons of awards, a fascinating history and a charming patio restaurant overlooking the 18th hole, it elevates the simple joy of golf to an unforgettable experience among the world's most majestic landscapes.

#### THE BOATHOUSE

Located behind Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge (p.52) and directly beside Lac Beauvert, this charming wooden hut rents out tons of watercraft and equipment to get you out on the water. Try canoes, single kayaks, double kayaks, stand-up paddleboards, pedal boats, water bike, voyageur canoes (with up to 12-person capacity). As its French name suggests, Lac Beauvert has beautiful blue-green water that's so clear you can see straight to the rocky lake bottom in certain places. Prefer to explore the lake from land? The Boathouse also rents out mountain bikes and children's bikes; a path circles the lake and connects to many trails beyond it. Staying at the hotel? Guests get a 15% discount on rentals.






#### MALIGNE LAKE CRUISE

Spirit Island is possibly the most famous sight in Jasper National Park, if not the entire Rocky Mountains. And yet it's not exactly easy to get to. Located about halfway down the 22.5-kilometre Maligne Lake, it can only be reached by boat. Instead of paddling all day, hop aboard the Maligne Lake Cruise, which will get you there and back in an hour and a half, with free time on a trail overlooking the remarkable landmark itself. Along the way, pass glaciers, watch the water colour change, and enjoy vibrant stories from the onboard tour guide, including the history of Maligne Lake and its earliest explorers, along with the geology, glaciology, flora & fauna of the area.

#### WILDLIFE WATCHING

Part of the reason Jasper was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site is because of the abundant fauna that live in the national park. This includes many iconic Canadian animals like elk, caribou, moose, mountain goats, bighorn sheep, bears, wolves, plus a variety of birds and many smaller creatures like marmots and pikas.

#### Help keep wildlife wild:

- 1. Never feed or bait animals.
- **2.** Always keep your distance (use a telephoto lens for zoomed in pictures).
- **3.** Stay in your vehicle if watching from the road.

#### **GUIDED TOURS**

While there's always the possibility of seeing something on your own, a professional wildlife watching tour will take quests to lesser-known areas of the park and can increase your chances of a sighting (though can't guarantee it - these are wild animals and not confined by fences after all) while keeping you safe. The knowledgeable guides also give a more well-rounded understanding of the local fauna, and letting someone else do the driving means you can focus on the sights and not the road. Some of the best times to see wildlife are spring (when furry babies abound) and fall (when the elk rut makes males more active - and dangerous).

**SunDog Tour Co.'s (p.29)** year-round wildlife tours include guided transportation on mini-coach buses with oversized sightseeing windows (some even slide open, enabling unobstructed photography).

Maligne Adventures (p.28) highly rated wildlife tours are offered after sunrise or before sunset from May 4 to October 4. Complimentary pick-up is available from select accommodations.

Wildland Photo Tours (p.41) is perfect for shutterbugs. Their private wildlife-focused photo tours are capped at 3 participants, last four hours, and run from April until June.

Jasper Hikes & Tours Inc.'s (p.19) Wildlife & Hike experience starts around 7 a.m. and ends mid-afternoon. Picnic lunch provided for an additional fee. Offered in May/June and September.

#### 3. SHOPPING

Pick up the perfect souvenir from your trip at one of Jasper's retailers. Specialty stores stock top-of-the-line ski gear, backcountry equipment and fashionable lifestyle attire (**p.10**).

#### 6. JASPER YELLOWHEAD MUSEUM AND ARCHIVES

No visit to Jasper would be complete without a stop at this charming hidden gem. Located a few blocks from downtown, the museum tells Jasper's story through both permanent exhibits and temporary showcases that frequently leaves visitors pleasantly surprised by their quality.

Explore the history of Indigenous and Métis people in the area, the fur trade, the railway, European exploration, the story of Mt. Alberta's first ascent by Japanese climbers and early tourism in the national park. This haven of history is also where the Jasper-Yellowhead Historical Society

puts on events like speaker series, farmer's markets, art sales, and more. Souvenir hunters will delight in the gift shop, which is one of the best places in town to find local books, unique historical trinkets, and gorgeous artwork.

#### MUSEUM

Bookmark time to explore the Jasper Yellowhead Museum and Archives (p.33). Learn about early Indigenous populations, the first European explorers including David Thompson, the railway, and Jasper's early tourism.



#### HORSEBACK RIDING

Ride gentle and well-trained western mountain horses along one- or two-hour trails that offer spectacular views. From first time rider to horse whisperer, all experience levels will enjoy this hooved foray into nature. Jasper Riding Stables staff match guests to horses based on ability and profile, then, giddy-up into the forests and along sweeping ridges that the Pyramid Bench and Cottonwood Creek areas are known for. This activity is suited for kids six years old and older. In the winter, snuggle under a blanket for a magical, bell-laden sleigh ride along Pyramid Lake (only offered on select days, weather permitting).



## **DOG TRAVEL**

There's plenty of Jasper adventures you can have with your furriest family member. Make your trip extra special (for both you and Fido!) with these dog-friendly tips.



### **Tips for dog owners**

Parks Canada regulations state that all domestic animals must be always kept on a leash or in suitable confinement. Pets must not be left unattended at campsites or in vehicles. Never allow your pet to chase any wild animal in the park, and always clean up after them.

DO

Want to do a non-dog friendly activity like skiing or horseback riding? The local company My Jasper Nanny (p.35) will come to your hotel or campsite to make sure your pets get the exercise they need (or you can bring your dog to the carer's home).





#### HIKING

If booking with Jasper Hikes & Tours (p.19), ask in advance whether dogs are allowed on your chosen tour. Note that when hiking on your own, select trails don't allow dogs (even leashed) due to endangered wildlife habitat.

#### RAFTING

Strap on a canine-approved life jacket and see the sights from the river! Jasper Raft Tours (p.26) offers dog-friendly trips, lasting between 1.5 to 2.5 hours.

#### CANOEING OR SUPPING

Rent a canoe or standup paddleboard from the Boathouse at Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge (p.27). If you see canine ambassador Calla, feel free to say hi to this golden cutie.

#### PATIO DINING

The Maligne Canyon Wilderness Kitchen, Jasper Brewing Co., and Jasper Pizza Place all have sizable outdoor spaces that allow dogs. Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge's Great Hall even has a special Pet Menu.

#### **SKYTRAM**

The tram car is cozy, but for a fee well-behaved dogs can soar to the summit of Whistlers Mountain on the Jasper SkyTram (p.39).

#### **DOG PARK**

Jasper's only fully fenced offleash dog park is located at the intersection of Sleepy Hollow Rd. and Hazel Ave.

## 7 THINGS TO DO AT JASPER SKYTRAM

Jasper SkyTram makes it easy to gain a jaw-dropping bird's-eye view of Jasper National Park, but there's more to do at the top of Whistlers Mountain than simply stand in awe. Here's a taste of what awaits.

#### **LEARN**

During the sevenminute flight up the mountain, your SkyTram guide explains various aspects of the tramway and the surrounding mountain ranges. Soar to an elevation of 2,263 metres, then alight and wander the interpretive boardwalk.

#### HIKE

From the upper station, a 1.4 kilometre hiking trail leads all the way to the summit of Whistlers Mountain. Please remember that weather in the alpine environment can be unpredictable. Always be safe, prepared, and dress appropriately.

#### **SNOWSHOE**

Since the alpine snowpack melts slower than in the valleys, spring visitors can explore the summit using one of Canada's classic winter transportation methods. Come prepared with winter gear from head to toe. Equipment rentals available at the upper station retail store.

#### **EAT**

The fully licensed Summit Café serves classic and delicious entrees, desserts, soups and snacks with a hearty side of panoramic views.

#### **STARGAZE**

Get a little closer to the stars with the annual Star Sessions, available Fridays in September and Fridays & Saturdays in October. Join astronomy experts at the SkyTram for an exclusive dining and stargazing experience with the most powerful telescopes in the Canadian Rockies.


#### **SPOT WILDLIFE**

Whistlers Mountain was named for the hoary marmot's whistling alert call. Watch for these furry critters as well as the white-tailed ptarmigan, ground squirrels, pikas and perhaps even bighorn sheep. For brief periods in the summer, enjoy the alpine wildflowers. See wildlife rules on visitor guide pull out map.

and personal experience which includes musical performances and Cree legends from singer and drummer Matricia Bauer, whose traditional name of Iskoachitaw waciy / △nd △nrc ◆r+ translates to "she who moves mountains." The event is held every Wednesday evening yearround. Or, join her Wapakwanis

Plant Walk, Make and Talk, where Bauer shows participants the local landscape through an Indigenous lens, highlighting flora with medicinal and traditional significance, then leading the group through the process of making a product to take home. Tea enthusiasts take note of her new winter offering: Tawaw Nihty. This time-honoured ritual includes a healing cup of tea made with Indigenous herbology and runs in the morning (Sakastew), mid-day (Nemawin), evening (Pahkisimon) or at midnight (Apihtatipiskaw).

#### JASPER THEATER PRODUCTIONS

After the day's adventures wind down, the evening entertainment heats up. For a rollicking good time, grab a ticket to Jasper Theater Production's premier show "From Jasper With Love." This one-hour rollercoaster includes a cocktail of sketches with an evolving cast of silly and lovable characters that desperately, hilariously, try to warn the audience away from Jasper (lest they fall under its spell and never want to leave). In addition to laughs, the performance also gives a solid overview of Jasper's culture and highlights, through scenes and stories that cover popular local situations like sightseeing, stargazing and wildlife watching.

The play was created by – and mirrors the personal story of – two Dutch expats who, well, visited Jasper then never left. With the duo's decade of onstage experience, the entire production feels polished and is a joy to watch, earning an enthusiastic stamp of approval from even theatre-wary locals.

Doors open a half hour before the show begins, letting audience members grab a drink from Pieter or Joost behind the bar (say hi, they'll soon be on stage) and wander outside for mountain views on The Skyline Lounge deck. It's one of the greatest hidden gem patios in town, and a fitting complement to an absolute diamond of a show.

#### JASPER ART GALLERY

Seeing Jasper has been described as walking through a painting—which might explain why so many gifted artists have found inspiration here. And there's no better place to appreciate the wealth of local creativity than at the Jasper Art Gallery. Located within the Jasper Library and Cultural Centre, the Gallery is run by the Jasper Artists Guild, a grassroots organization that promotes visual fine arts within the region. In addition to the excellent original landscape and abstract art it exhibits (pro tip: these one-of-a-kind pieces make for truly memorable souvenirs and bring mountain charm to any home's décor) the gallery also has prints, cards and a small selection of crafts for sale. Even for casual admirers, the gallery is worth a visit. Natural light bathes the modern space, and

the colourful art shines against stone walls, a wooden stairway and polished concrete floors. From oils to watercolour and from wood carvings to stained glass, the varied mediums reflect the ever-changing beauty that waits just outside.



#### COMMEMORATION **PARK**

See the Jim Vena Stage at CN place, where all the best outdoor concerts and events are held.

#### **JASPER INDIGENOUS EXHIBIT**

Located on the lawn of the Information Centre. the exhibit creates a space for Indigenous Partners to communicate their connection to the land and recognize the history of displacement. Opening in September 2024.

#### **CENTENNIAL PARK**

Built to celebrate Canada's centennial, Jasper's major park has a playground, three ball diamonds, a soccer/ rugby pitch, public washrooms, and picnic area.

#### **JASPER** INFORMATION **CENTRE**

Over the years, this heritage stone structure has served as a warden house, administration office, a museum and even a fish hatchery.

#### **VISITOR EXPERIENCE CENTRE**

Get in-person quidance, helpful

recommendations at this fun new venue next to the Old Fire Hall. More info on **p.7**.

#### **TRAIN STATION**

When it was built in 1925, this station was one of the largest and finest in the country, with large cobblestone chimneys and exposed rafter ends. It is a big part of the town's origin story.

#### **OLD FIRE HALL**

Built in the Rustic Style favoured by national parks in the 20's and 30's with a steeply gabled roof and a corner tower, this prominent landmark is recognized for its historical and architectural value.

#### **JASPER THE BEAR**

Jasper's friendly mascot is located a few places around town. Can you find all three spots?





### **Mural Tour**

Thanks to the UpLift! Jasper Mural Festival, many walls around town have been transformed into art pieces. These seven murals are listed by the artist that painted them.

#### **OLA VOLO MURAL**

Originally from Kazakstan, this Canadian muralist's style draws from folklore, multiculturalism and identity. It is Jasper's largest mural.

#### **BB ISKWEW MURAL**

Awash in purple (a colour associated with kokums in Cree culture), this Indigenous-made mural honours the artist's grandmother.

#### **FIVE EIGHT MURAL**

Glitchy, green, and gorgeous, this fun and funky piece was inspired by a photo of the artist's girlfriend that was edited to have static lines.

#### **ALEX KWONG MURAL**

A photorealistic portrait of longtime local Della Sens, who's lived in the little white house that sits in the middle of downtown for nearly 80 years.

#### KEENAN SILLENCE MURAL

Jasper's only mural to navigate multiple surfaces instead of a single flat wall. Inspired by Japanese animation classic 'Princess Mononoke.'

#### KALUM TEKE DAN MURAL

Painted entirely by brush (as opposed to spray paint) this Indigenous-made piece is called 'Sacred Fire' and depicts an eagle and chief's headdress.

#### **FLUKE MURAL**

This 77-foot explosion of colour celebrates the national park, with various wildlife and a train.

# **THE JASPER INDIGENOUS EXHIBIT**

Indigenous communities connected to Jasper National Park have been seeking an immersive, artistic, and truthtelling space in the park since the early 2000s. The Jasper Indigenous Exhibit is an answer to this request, and the result of over a decade of careful planning and relationship building between Indigenous partners and Parks Canada.

Central to the stories being told here is the forced removal of Indigenous people from the lands now known as Jasper National Park, and the impact this history has on Indigenous communities to this day. The Indigenous Exhibit Working Group, including representatives from Indigenous communities connected to Jasper, has led the exhibit design, artwork selection, drafting of text and planning for the opening ceremony.

A grand opening ceremony is scheduled for September 7 and 8, 2024, to celebrate the meaningful relationships and elements that were built through completion of this exhibit.

The Jasper Indigenous Exhibit is an example of Indigenous partners coming together with Parks Canada to work towards reconciliation. The intent is to present and commemorate Indigenous histories connected to this area, now known as Jasper National Park, for present and future generations.

The focal point at the centre of the Jasper Indigenous Exhibit is in place. The collaborative Indigenous art installation features an impressive bronze eagle landing on a steel sphere overlaid with words from six different Indigenous languages including Anishinaabe, Cree, Dene-zaa, Michif, Secwepemctsín and Stoney.

#### JASPER PLANETARIUM

Pack a galaxy's worth of perspectives into a single evening with this fascinating and interactive yearround experience. In the Jasper Planetarium's 40-seat domed theatre, a live guide will tour you through many of Jasper's best stargazing spots, getting panoramic views of the aurora borealis, explanations behind Indigenous constellations, and local tips for astro-exploration. Package the Planetarium Experience with the Telescope Experience and see the stars through the largest telescope in the Canadian Rockies. Cloudy skies? See pre-recorded objects through the video telescope (or opt for their twoyear raincheck policy). The new radio telescope will even let you "see" black holes in the middle of the day. Fun and family-friendly, these tours are great options for kids whose bedtimes fall before the sun does.

#### **JASPER STAR TRAILS**

Inspect galaxies, nebulas, planets and more on this outdoor telescope and stargazing tour. Led by passionate astronomy guides, this two-hour outdoor experience uses laser-pointers, local expertise and both optical and digital telescopes to help you go deeper into all things space. It operates beside the gorgeous Lake Annette, so bring blankets, chairs, cameras, snacks and a curious mind ready to learn how to find constellations. The telescopes work well even in 60% cloud cover but if the sky is completely overcast then the tour leans more into the educational side of things: the origin and life cycle of stars (see past images captured by their telescopes) and the technology involved in astronomy, recent discoveries and the future space race.

# TASTE OF THE ROCKIES

With everything from gourmet comfort food to panoramic patios to a droolworthy après-ski scene, Jasper is a culinary melting pot that's as delicious as it is unique.



#### **PATIOS & PICNICS**

Nothing says summer like relaxing on a patio. In Jasper, it's also a supremely pleasant shortcut to getting your daily dose of fresh mountain air and top-notch people-watching. Stroll down Connaught Dr. or Patricia St. on any fine day and you'll find lots of places to sit outside, but there are some special spots to look for. Jasper Pizza Place has a beautiful rooftop patio with tropical vibes, delicious margaritas and nice views (also peep the stunning wall mural by Indigenous artist Kalum Teke Dan). Or, you can get take-out from your favourite place and head to one of the many picnic spots around and outside of town. Lay down a blanket on the green lawn in front of the Jasper Information Centre, or grab a table at Pyramid Lake Beach, Lake Annette or Maligne Lake, where The View serves up a curated menu of small plates and shareables.

#### APRÈS-SKI

There are few winter traditions as revered in mountain towns as aprèsski. After shredding the slopes all day (or returning from some other wintery adventure) it's time to strip down to your cozy base layers and a toque to relive the day with pals around a bunch of comfort food and drinks. Feel right at home with the Jasper Brewing Co.'s casual ambiance and variety of beers on tap. Or, replenish those spent calories with a cheesy take-out from Hearthstone Pizza. Alternatively, if you're wrapping up earlier in the afternoon then kick back with a brewski at one of Marmot Basin's on-mountain chalets (the Kokanee Glacier Deck has amazing views). End the night with a refined scotch cocktail from Ursidae Lair.



#### SCENIC DINING

Enjoying a meal with a great view might seem like a given in Jasper. But there's some restaurants that raise the bar—sometimes literally. Take the **Summit Café**, located at the top of Whistlers Mountain. While you can work up an appetite by hiking to this full-service establishment, most opt to take the Jasper Skytram (**p.39**) shortcut flight. The elevated **Aalto Restaurant** overlooks Pyramid Lake and has gourmet seafood with artful presentations. **Tekarra Restaurant**'s sun-soaked patio is only surpassed by their fully licensed ridge overlooking

the Athabasca River. The **Maligne Canyon Wilderness Kitchen** is right next to its namesake, and from the patio you can see the rushing river that has, over time, carved through rock to create this geological wonder. For views over the sparkling Lac Beauvert, **The Great Hall** at the Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge (**p.52**) has all-day dining and a refined gastropub menu.

#### **UNIQUE EATS**

Want to make your meal extra memorable? Jasper Food Tours has multiple exceptional tours. The Downtown Foodie Tour is the most popular, with daily departure, a mystery itinerary and year-round availability. But if you have a passion for or interest in backcountry cooking techniques then the summer Peak Nic experience is a must, while the Bites on E-bikes tour visits multiple hidden gem eateries tucked in the wilderness just outside of town. For unique takes on farm to table dining, the newly revamped restaurant Terra offers a seasonal menu with some tasty surprises in a chic setting. Evil Dave's Grill serves up wickedly delicious food, with globally inspired takes on locally sourced ingredients. Their cocktails are also inventive and highly recommended. Harvest Food & Drink is beloved for their brunches but their dinner menu is equally drool-worthy.





#### **FESTIVAL FAVS**

Jasperites love celebrating, and that shows in the special culinary events that happen during festivals (p.12). We're talking themed menus, irresistible deals, and once-a-year dishes that you'll still be thinking about long after the party has passed. The year kicks off with Jasper in January, a three-week winter bash during which many restaurants in town compete in the Poutine Showdown. Mountain Malanka brings Ukrainian food and drink to the forefront, while Taste of Spring celebrates all things art, food, and culture. During the Jasper Dark Sky Festival there's always fascinating new culinary experiences to be had, like dining under the stars at the top of a mountain. And then there are events like **Devour: Food Film Fest** and Christmas in November, where food plays a starring role in the whole thing. Even the Jasper Pride & Ski Festival has its own rainbow themed cookies.





#### FRONT COUNTRY CAMPING

The campgrounds in Jasper are managed by Parks Canada, and offer convenient services, including firewood and bear-proof food lockers. Among the largest of the campgrounds is Whistlers Campground, which is freshly renovated to include a new registration centre, improved sites, modernized underground services (including water, sewer and electrical systems) and new washroom and shower facilities. It is the largest single-entry campground in North America, and some campsites have more sun and greater mountain views as planted saplings are still growing. Bike paths link the campground to town.

Quiet hours after 11 p.m. help maintain a family-friendly atmosphere at all campgrounds. Note: Demand for sites is high from June through September, with July and August at the peak. To avoid disappointment, Parks Canada recommends reserving a spot before arriving in the park.

#### BACKCOUNTRY CAMPING

Dotted along Jasper's thousands of kilometres of trails there are rugged campgrounds that provide basic infrastructure for multi-day hikers. If proper preparation and safety precautions are taken, this unique option can offer memorable experiences and some truly stunning views.
